BROTHERHOOD RIDE 2017 - CYCLING FOR FALLEN HEROES

Our 2017 Ride will be dedicated to 20 Fallen Heroes from Florida and New York who died in the line of duty in 2016 while protecting their communities. Our team of (30) riders and (15) support members will honor them by cycling through the state of Florida in 7 days, covering over 600 miles and average 80-100 miles a day. The ride will begin on July 23rd from North Naples, FL. We will travel up the west coast, over to the central part of the state, then head down the east coast and end on July 29th in Miami, FL.

The Brotherhood Ride is a non-profit charity organization, which consists of Firefighters, Law Enforcement Officers and EMS personnel who ride bicycles to honor emergency first responders who have died in the line of duty. Our mission is to provide emotional and financial support to the families on or near the anniversary of their death.

The Brotherhood Ride continues the tradition of Honor, Dedication and Pride. Over the past nine years, we have honored the memory and sacrifice of 511 Emergency First Responders, which includes firefighters, law enforcement officers and emergency medical personnel. Our team has traveled on bicycles over 7,700 miles, through sixteen states, have been hosted by over forty Elks Lodges nationwide and assisted by countless emergency first responders who have shown the true meaning of Brotherhood.

Through year-round fundraising efforts, the Brotherhood Ride has been able to honor the memory of 511 fallen heroes and provide emotional and financial support to their families. Past Brotherhood Rides, we have honored our fallen brothers and sisters from SC, TX, NY, FL, TN, VA, PA, NJ, CT and MA and we are very proud to have donated over \$379,000.00 to the families left behind.

The Brotherhood Ride is a non-profit 501(c)(3) public charity organization. Other than the cost of conducting the rides, all donated proceeds go directly to the beneficiaries designated. No one is compensated for their time in order to maximize the impact of donations.

During the ride, 30 riders and their support team of 15: will average 80–100 miles a days, will meet with local fire departments and law enforcement agencies to show the spirit of Brotherhood.
