Our Mission is to provide emotional and financial support to the families of emergency responders who have died in the line of duty. We also hope to offer emotional support to their coworkers and community.

The Brotherhood Ride is a non-profit 501(c)(3) public charity organization entirely comprised of volunteers, who are themselves, emergency responders: firefighters, police officers and EMS personnel. Other than the cost of conducting the rides, all donated proceeds go directly to the beneficiaries designated. No one is compensated for their time in order to maximize the impact of donations.

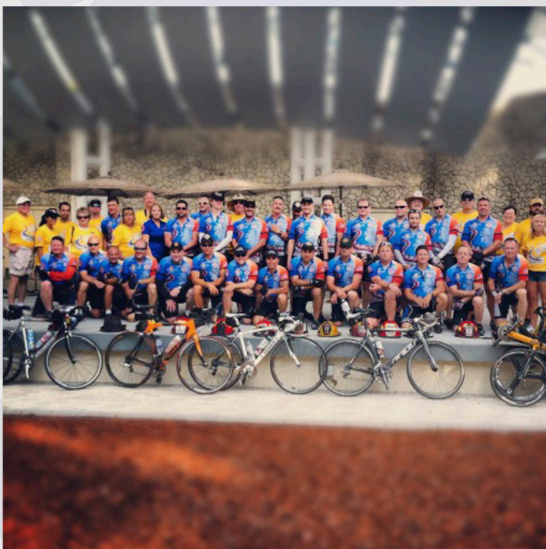
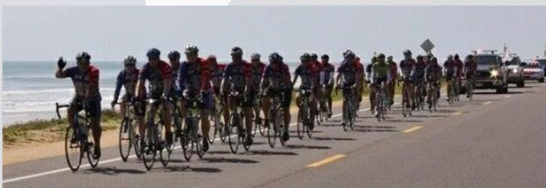
